

## Seniors Health SCN™ 2018 Summer Studentship Competition Outcome

The Scientific Office of the Seniors Health SCN is pleased to announce the outcome of the 2018 Undergraduate Summer Studentship Competition. The competition aims to increase the number of undergraduate students engaged in health and aging research across Alberta, facilitate the pursuit of knowledge, and build capacity related to the three Seniors Health SCN priority areas.

Twenty-three applications were submitted to the competition. The submissions addressed research questions relevant to the "Aging Brain Care", "Frailty, Resilience, Aging-well: Late-life Transitions Initiative (FRAILTI)", and/or "Anticipating and Aging Alberta" platforms of the Seniors Health SCN. All applications were adjudicated by 3 reviewers based on 4 assessment criteria.

The Scientific Office awarded studentships to 5 high-quality applications. The winners and their projects can be found in the table (below). Students will undertake their research project in the summer months, and submit their final report to the SCN in the early fall.
