# FAQ: Diabetes Medication Adjustment Protocol - Adult

#### 1. Why was this protocol developed?

To develop a provincial governance protocol to standardize and support the current practice of diabetes medication adjustments (including insulin) in diabetes specialty care centres provincially.

#### 2. What is a protocol?

AHS policy services defines a protocol as a practice support document aimed at fostering decisions or streamlining a particular process within a programs routine boundaries. Protocol: Prescribe interventions for undertaking specific investigations, therapies and/or activities in an identified situation, in either a clinical or a corporate setting.

#### 3. Who developed this protocol?

The Diabetes, Obesity & Nutrition Strategic Clinical Network™ (DON SCN) in collaboration with clinicians working in diabetes specialty centres across AHS zones, Covenant Health and Primary Care Network members co-developed this protocol. A working group membership is attached at the end of the document.

4. How do I know if the ambulatory centre I work in is identified as a diabetes specialty centre?

The DON SCN has shared information with all Zone Executive Leaders (ZEL) identifying centers that may meet the criteria determined by working group membership. If you are unsure, you can speak with your program manager for clarity.

#### 5. How do I know if the protocol has been ordered?

In Connect Care the referral for 'Diabetes Education' has the order pre-selected to support the diabetes care provider in using this protocol, if appropriate. Each program involved in the development of the protocol can connect with the DON SCN to facilitate updates to paper referrals, if required.

#### 6. Where can I find resources to help support the use of the protocol?
