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## **General Coaching Tips**

- Locate all contact & droplet patient spaces and check isolation carts for adequate supplies and signage (e.g., AGMP sign)
- If available, assist visitors with PPE questions with primary guidance coming from the patient's primary healthcare provider
- Common language (e.g., proceed and pause)
  - · Review steps for PPE safety
- Provide just-in-time feedback that includes meaningful rationale
- Stay current with PPE changes including continuous masking and eye protection
- Know when PPE needs to be changed
- Patients are not required to wear isolation gowns or gloves when being transported from their room or treatment space



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
