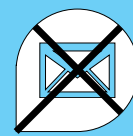

The CHIA Gala is a yearly event held to recognize leadership and innovation in eHealth. The event is hosted by COACH: Canada's Health Informatics Association. COACH is the voice of health informatics (HI) in Canada, promoting the adoption, practice and professionalism of HI. COACH represents a diverse community of accomplished, influential professionals who work passionately to make a difference in advancing healthcare through information technology.

NEPHROLOGY ADVICE REQUEST DELAYED

After review of user acceptance testing and feedback, Nephrology Leadership have chosen to delay participation in eReferral until further notice. Alberta Netcare eReferral continues to provide referral capability for hip and knee joint replacement surgery and routine medical/radiation oncology for breast and lung cancer.

A June release of enhancements includes a shorter re-organized

referral forms to improve workflow and usability.

In Fall 2016, eReferral will announce details of the provincial 3 year rollout, including specialty onboarding timelines and version upgrades.

QuRE FUNDAMENTALS WORKSHOP DEBUTS AT UCALGARY DEPT OF FAMILY MEDICINE

Quality Referral Evolution (QuRE) is now in its second year of development and is scheduling resident workshops for all medical education programs in Alberta throughout the summer and into the fall.

The workshop focuses on the importance of quality physician referral communication, the elements required for referral composition and local/provincial resources to find specialty specific referral information. Participants will

leave with a solid review of referral basics: how to write the referral, who to send it to, what to include, and where to find that information.

The foundation of the workshop is the QuRE Pocket Checklist, which details the minimum requirements for a quality referral or consult letter. QuRE has received much positive feedback about the checklist and have distributed over 3000 to medical practitioners since last summer.

Recently, the checklists were brought to Gothenburg, Sweden for the International Forum on Quality and Safety in Healthcare and caught the attention of the British Royal Society of Medicine;

discussions are now in play to have QuRE present in London, England at the International Forum on Quality & Safety in Health Care in 2017.

In general, the checklist is appreciated for being a physical tool that can be easily carried around and conveniently referenced without access to a computer or smart phone; commenters also valued that the checklist includes points for both referral letters and consult notes, which is seen to support reciprocal communication.

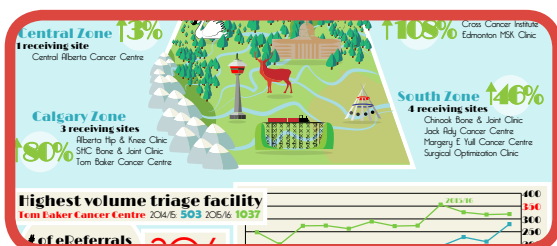
