## Manage an outbreak in LTC, DSL and hospice sites

All staff share the responsibility for keeping residents safe. Complete the following actions when a COVID-19 outbreak is confirmed. This checklist provides general measures only – refer to the corresponding section in the <u>Guide for Outbreak Prevention & Control in Long Term Care</u>, <u>Designated Supportive Living</u>, and <u>Hospice Sites</u> for detailed recommendations. When applicable, follow site-specific policies.
