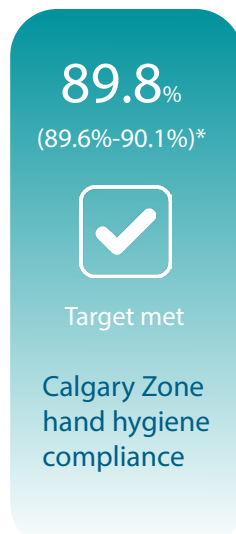
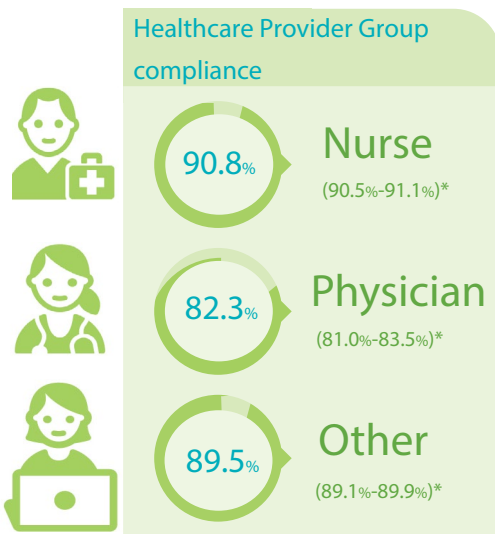




Your 4 Moments for Hand Hygiene

The Calgary Zone Hand Hygiene Committee reconvened and has expanded its purpose, function and scope. The committee – now known as the Calgary Zone IPC Practice Development Committee – reports to the Calgary Zone IPC Committee and is responsible for improving and sustaining various IPC-related practices and initiatives in the zone. These include monitoring the ongoing effectiveness of the Provincial PPE Safety Coach Program, collection of hand hygiene compliance reviews, routine practices and IPC risk assessments. The group will also evaluate available hand hygiene compliance reviews to identify ongoing opportunities for improvement and recognition of success as well as provide direction and decision making for efforts so relevant Accreditation Canada Required Organizational Practices are met. Membership includes leaders from acute care, community, rural, continuing care, and various programs as well as patient and family advisor.
