## Re: Prenatal Pertussis Immunization Now Part of Routine Provincial Immunization Program

Commencing January 1, 2019, dTap vaccine (diphtheria, tetanus, acellular pertussis) is recommended for all pregnant women in Alberta during each pregnancy, regardless of previous immunization history. This is to protect newborn infants from pertussis when the risk of complications and death are high until they receive their first pertussis immunization at 2 mo. of age. The vaccine has been demonstrated to be 90% effective in children less than 3 mo. of age and safe during pregnancy.

Administration is recommended to occur between 27 and 32 weeks gestation to maximize placental antibody transfer for infants born after 37 weeks. If necessary, vaccine can be given prior to 27 weeks for the purpose of wound management, travel, or anticipated premature delivery; there is no need to re-immunize later in pregnancy. It can also be given later than 32 weeks, up until delivery. Following delivery, it should only be given if there is no record of administration of a dose at age 18 yrs. or older, the standard recommendation for all adults.

Immunization is available from Public Health Nursing at Community Health Centres, some Physicians/Nurse Practitioners, and Pharmacists. Non-prescribing pharmacists require a physician prescription. All providers must check immunization records in Netcare or MediTech before immunizing and report all doses provided.
