

Come directly to the hospital if:

- You have had contractions lasting about 60 seconds every five minutes for one hour
- You are unable to walk or talk through the contractions
- Your water breaks
- You have bright bleeding, like a period
- You are in need of pain medication
- You are worried with your baby's movements

COVID-19 Visitor Screening

Upon entry to the hospital, our COVID-19 screeners will greet you to conduct a health screening and ensure you are:

- Verified and wearing Designated Family Support or visitor identification
- Feeling well, and complete the health screening prior to entering the facility
- 14 years of age and older OR accompanied by an adult.
- All visitors and Designated Family Support Persons are strongly recommended to be fully immunized

While in the hospital, all visitors must:

- Continuously wear a mask that covers the nose and mouth.
- Remain in the patient's room as much as possible and minimize movement within the facility.
- Hand washing and/or use of hand sanitizer when entering/leaving the facility and when entering/leaving the patient's room.
- Practice physical distancing at all times.

Admitting & Triage



All mothers in labor or in need of assessment should go to the Triage -Emergency Department before going to Maternity Unit or the Non-Stress Test Clinic.

If you are scheduled for an induction you may go to admitting in the Emergency Department.

Assessment and Induction

After you have been seen in the Emergency Department, you may be advised to go to Maternity for further care.

Proceed to the second floor, and you will be greeted by a nurse at the main desk.

Your support person may join you.

What you can expect next

Your care provider will meet you to:

- Review the reason why you are here
- Review your prenatal papers
- Check your blood pressure, pulse, and temperature
- Check your baby's heart rate and pattern
- Check your cervix
- Collect urine and blood samples (if needed)

Your healthcare team works together to provide the best possible care for you and your family.

The most important part of the team is you.

We will involve you in the decisions about treatment, care and care plans. Let us know what matters most to you. Your care team will let you know their name, role and why they are here to see you.

Birthing Room



Once you have been assessed and admitted for labor, you will be moved to a birthing room on Maternity when available.

This is a room with the equipment and supplies needed for your delivery.

















Latex & Scents

- For the health and safety of patients, visitors and the care teams, do not use scented products like perfume or cologne in patient areas
- Please check with unit regarding flowers.

• Please do not bring latex balloons as they are not permitted on the unit.

Smoking & Tobacco

- Smoking tobacco and tobacco-like products such as e-cigarettes, vaping, or marijuana, is not allowed on Alberta Health Services property.
- If you would like to quit smoking, talk to your care team about helpful resources and cessation aids or visit MyHealth.Alberta

Clean Hands

- Cleaning your hands is the best way to stop spreading germs.
- Everyone should wash their hands often, including before and after visiting, using the washroom, eating, and donning and doffing personal protective equipment, including putting facemasks on or off.



Newborn Resuscitation & Stabilization

 If your baby needs extra care and monitoring, the labour and delivery unit and operating room have immediate access to special care unit staff and equipment.



Cesarean Section Recovery Room

• Your baby may be able to go to the recovery room with you, if all is well. Check with your nursing staff.



 Your support person may join you in the operating room, but they will go back to the Maternity unit while you stay in the recovery room.



Semi Private Rooms



• Occasionally you may have to share a semi private room.

• If you are staying in a semi private room, you can expect to be sharing your room and bathroom with another patient and baby.

Infant Car Seats

- Legally in Alberta, babies must be in a car seat while in a private vehicle.
- You will require the baby's car seat when you are ready to go home with your baby.
- Remember to bring your car seat, baby blankets, baby clothes and diapers in to the hospital when the baby is discharged.



Cultural, Spiritual and Religious Diversity
