Who is Supportive Care?

When to refer?

If your patient has a cancer- or treatment-related issue that is limiting or preventing them from returning to or staying at work or school.

How to refer:

- Within CCA and the cancer centre where service is located send referral using the Putting Patients First Questionnaire for Psychosocial Oncology, Rehabilitation Oncology and Nutrition
- External to CCA –go the <u>Alberta Referral Directory</u> and use the search words "Psychosocial Oncology", "Rehabilitation Oncology" or "Nutrition Counselling Cancer". Select the patient's preferred site and use the site's referral form.
